

KMHA Rep Program

Kamloops Minor Hockey (KMHA) participates in the Rep hockey program governed by the Okanagan Mainline Amateur Hockey Association (OMAHA), BC Hockey and Hockey Canada.

Rep hockey brings together dedicated, skilled players and dedicated, experienced coaches to form teams to play against the best hockey players and coaches from other associations. Rep teams play in a league that permits players to compete against players of similar ability.

Mission Statement:

Kamloops Minor Hockey, in partnership with members and their families, is committed to:

- Providing a safe and positive minor hockey experience for all members regardless of gender, ethnicity, ability, or age.
- Fostering the love of the game by encouraging work ethic, sportsmanship, and teamwork.
- Building competitive Rep and Development programs with a wrap-around approach for excellence.
- Developing and attracting dynamic leadership throughout the organization.

Commitments:

Rep teams will only succeed where players and coaches are committed to the Mission statement and values of the Rep program. Rep hockey is an elite competitive program that is designed with the goal of achieving the highest level of hockey possible. The Rep program is built on commitment and dedication. Participation in Rep hockey requires a significant commitment from coaches, parents and players. Although there will be some discretion based on individual circumstances, the following is a high-level outline of what you can expect as a member of the KMHA Rep program.

What to expect:

- One 6:00am weekday practice
- One weekday afternoon/evening practice
- Scheduled team dryland sessions
- 1-2 ice times each weekend (games or practice) at home or away
- U11 up to 4 tournaments (1 home 3 out of town)
U13-U18 up to 6 out of town tournaments

Additional Fees:

Carding Fees:

Carding fees are determined by KMHA and must be paid by each successful Development/Rep player once they are named to a team. Part of the carding fees will cover additional costs including:

- Extra ice

Team Fees:

Team fees are determined by team staff and must be presented to the parent group for a final approval vote.

Team fees are based on the following considerations:

- Special Instruction – Power Skating and Goalie training (minimum of 8 1-hour sessions)
- Team apparel & dry land gear
- Out of town tournament fees

Parent volunteer and commitments:

- Jersey cleaning and organizing
- Score clock duties during home games
- Home tournament organization and duties as assigned
- On Ice Helpers
- Team Manager
- Treasurer
- Safety Person

If a parent signs up a player for a Rep tryout, and that player makes a team, then decides they do not want to play, they will forfeit their ability to tryout for a Rep hockey team in the following season, except under special circumstances.
